

Timmins Ski Racers Inc.

Summary of Fees:

- 1. Program Fees - Outlined in detail below; \$450-\$600 based on age**
- 2. ACA/AOA- Imposed by provincial and national governing bodies. Must be paid to be involved with any club activity.**
 - Age 5-9 - \$90**
 - Age 10-11 - \$147.50**
 - Age 12-13 - \$162.50**
 - Age 14 and up - \$162.50**

These are paid directly online through the AOA website.
- 3. NOD (divisional) Fees -**
 - Ages 5-7- \$45**
 - Ages 8 and up - \$60**
- 4. One \$200 Fundraising cheque for Yuk Yuk's tickets (can be fully recovered through sales). Every family will receive 20 tickets to start and are fully responsible for the sale of at least 10**
- 5. \$100 Fundraising cheque for 'Beer for a Year' fundraiser tickets. 10 tickets at \$10 each (can be fully recovered through sales).**
- 6. Dryland training fee according to program.**

Program Fees:

Introduction to Racing - U10:

This program is for children aged 5 to 9 years old and provides an introduction to ski racing with the development of race skills. Children do need to be able to ski independently and use the lifts with minimal assistance.

On-Hill training program: commencing (December 2016 to March 2017), includes training every Saturday and Sunday, Christmas Camp: Dec 27-31, March Break Camp and In-house Races: Dates TBD

Total Cost: \$ 450.00 + NOD Fee = \$495/\$510

Cost for 1 day/Week program: \$350 + NOD Fee = \$395/\$410

NOD Fees: \$45 for U8 athletes and \$60 for U10

Northern Ontario Ski Division Racing Program:

This is a competitive ski racing program for experienced athletes aged 10-11 years (U12), 12-13 years (U14), 14-15 years (U16) & 16+ years (U18/U20). Fees includes the same components as above: On-Hill Training, Christmas Camp, March Break Camp and In-house Races.

Total Cost: \$600.00 + NOD Fees(\$60) = \$660

Fall Dryland Training Program

Dryland will start September 2016 and will run until the hill opens.

U10- One day/week -\$50

U12 and up- One day/week -\$50 + Optional Spin Classes- additional \$50 for sessions running October 20- Dec. 8

This program is run by the coaches to focus on strength, speed and agility specific to downhill skiing. All Athletes must have their AOA waiver signed and TSR registration completed and paid in full before they can attend dryland training.

Payment Required At Registration (Payable to Timmins Ski Racers Inc.); Numbers 1-4 can be Combined in a single cheque:

1. Registration Fee + NOD Divisional Fee
2. One \$100 Cheque for Beer for a Year Draw Ticket Pre-Payment
3. \$200 cheque for Yuk Yuk's Tickets prepayment; Every family will be given 20 tickets to sell
4. \$50 or \$100 cheque for Dry Land training
5. \$100 undated Cheque to be used in event of Bingo no show

NOD fees were previously collected through the AOA website but this year are being paid directly to the division through TSR

All Registration Fees **MUST BE** paid up in full before athletes are allowed to train with the TSR

Registration includes eligible entry to Timmins Sponsored Race Series: Boreal Cup (Feb 4-5, 2017) and Slalom Derby (March 24-26, 2017)

-Registration **does not** include travel, accommodation, and race entry fees for out of town NOD Races, Ontario Provincial Championships and Out of Province events

-Race Fees paid will be refunded only in the event of Racer sickness or family tragedy

A Pre-season camp is available for experienced racers 8yrs and older at Mont Tremblant Que. December 18-22, 2016. The cost of the camp is NOT covered in registration.

Timmins City Bingo: Each family **must volunteer** to work their required quota of BINGO's. TSR has been allotted approximately 23 Bingo slots over the course of the year with two volunteers required at each. This is essential to cover the costs of coaching and keep racer fees down. Our team fees are presently among the lowest in the province and especially Northern Ontario. Signup for Bingo will take place at our AGM.

A \$100.00 undated cheque is required for Bingo deposit. This will be cashed if Bingo commitments are not met by the family or if the family fails to find a suitable replacement for commitments they cannot cover.

***Skiers with the TSR **CANNOT** train or race until the waiver is complete for each athlete. Each Parent/Guardian must sign in separately and sign the waiver form electronically. Help will be available at Registration night, the AGM and through board members if required.

Athlete/Parent Agreement

The Timmins Ski Racers Inc. Board of Directors requires the athlete and parents read, discuss, and sign this athlete/parent agreement prior to acceptance as a member of the Timmins Ski Racers organization and participation in the ski racing programs.

General

Timmins Ski Racers Inc. (TSR) undertakes to use all reasonable resources to assist team members to meet their goals and objectives. It is also our intention that all members of the TSR organization will be treated fairly and with courtesy and respect at all times. Athletes should realize that professional behaviour and a commitment to excellence will assist the athlete in meeting their goals and reflect positively both on the individual and the TSR organization as a whole. As representatives of the Timmins Ski Racer ski team we must not only strive to attain individual goals in ski racing, but also conduct ourselves in a way that reflects positively on our province, our ski association, and our clubs.

Team Rules

Timmins Ski Racers Inc.

The athlete agrees to the following:

- To observe the Skiers Responsibility Code and Ski Area Rules for each resort.
- To treat all coaches, athletes, TSR Members, race officials, hotel and restaurant staff, and all other individuals associated with the Team activity with courtesy and respect.
- To maintain a standard of tidiness in the TSR Chalet, Kamiskotia Snow Resort, other ski resort facilities, hotel rooms and the wax rooms.
- To respect team rules as set out by Coach and TSR Board of Directors – including curfew and dryland training.
- To respect all competition rules and the principles of Fair Play and Sportsmanship throughout the competition.
- To discuss grievances or problems of any nature, with the coaching staff in a timely manner.
- The use of tobacco or alcohol WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.
- The use of any illegal substances WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.
- Illegal activity of any kind WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.

The athlete and parent agree to the following:

- Harassment in any form WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.
- Bullying in any form WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.

The parent agrees to the following:

- To pay all **race entry fees** one week prior to scheduled event date, failure to do so will forfeit entry
- To purchase allocated tickets for TSR Gas Draw fundraiser and other fundraiser tickets (eg. Beer-4-a-Year)- cost is recovered by selling the tickets.
- **To fulfill assigned Timmins City Bingo duty day(s)** - If your schedule changes YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE for making arrangements for swaps with other parents
- To **volunteer at and fulfill** assigned parent volunteer duty for ski races held at Kamiskotia Snow Resort
- To participate on one or more committees within the TSR ie: Race Organization Committee, Banquet Committee, Sponsorship Committee, Maintenance Committee and Events Committee
- To respect all competition rules and the principles of Fair Play and Sportsmanship throughout the competition
- To discuss grievances or problems of any nature with Alpine Chair (Justyna Mittelstaedt) or other board member in a timely manner
- To gain level 1 officials status

Rules and Definitions

Harassment

Harassment is defined as conduct, gestures or comment which are reasonably considered insulting, intimidating, hurtful, malicious, degrading or other wise offensive to an individual or group of individuals, and which create a hostile or intimidating environment for work or sport activities, or which negatively affect performance or work conditions. Any of the different forms of harassment must be reasonably be considered to be based on the grounds prohibited in human rights legislation, such as race, ethnicity, colour, religion, age, sex, marital status, family status, disability, pardon conviction and sexual orientation. Harassment may occur between peers (i.e. athlete to athlete of the same age group, parent to coach, coach to coach) or between someone in a position of power or authority and an adult in a subordinate position (i.e. coach to athlete). Harassing behaviours among children less than 12 years of age may be defined as Bullying.

Bullying

Bullying involves a person expressing their power through the humiliation of another person. Bullying describes behaviours that are similar to harassment, but occur between children under the age of twelve, between youth or between adults. Bullies are typically cruel, demeaning and hostile towards the targets of their bullying. Bullying can be broken down into four types; physical (hit or kick victims; take/damage personal property), verbal (name calling; insults; constant teasing), relational (trying to cut off victims from social connection by convincing peers to exclude or reject a certain person), and reactive (engage in bullying as well as provoke bullies to attack by taunting them).

The Coaching staff will be responsible for all disciplinary action. All disciplinary action will be documented by the Coach and forwarded to the Timmins Ski Racers Inc. Board of Directors for review.

By signing below the athlete and parent acknowledge that they have read and accept the team rules. It is also understood that failure to observe the team rules may result in disciplinary action, not limited to suspension of membership in the TSR organization. Any athlete that is sent home due to disciplinary reasons will travel at their own expense.
